Transportation to/from Hotel

- There is no hotel shuttle service. Per the Convention and Visitors Bureau, the best cost is Uber or Lyft with an estimated cost of \$40-\$45 one way. Taxis are available but tend to cost more due to taxes.
- Also available is the <u>Super Shuttle Express</u>. One way cost is approximately \$68 for a four-passenger vehicle. If people choose to coordinate, the cost can then be divided. Reservations need to be made 24 hours in advance. Reservations online are free. Reservations made with an agent cost \$3.00.

Tour 1: Overland Park Arboretum & Botanical Gardens

Tuesday, May 27, 2025 8:45 am – 3:00 pm Cost: \$65.00

The 300-acre Overland Park Arboretum & Botanical Gardens is a vibrant educational, recreational, and cultural resource. Approximately 85% of the property is dedicated to the preservation and restoration of natural ecosystems.

You'll find over 1,700 species carefully cultivated across themed gardens and natural landscapes. It's a place where nature, art, and science converge, offering visitors of all ages an immersive outdoor experience.





The tour begins at the hotel where you'll take a short coach trip to the gardens. From there your options abound. You can choose a one hour guided walking tour or a one hour guided golf cart tour. Before or after your tour, you will be able to wander the grounds on your own.

Nearly six miles of paved and wood chip hiking trails wind their way through the Overland Park Arboretum & Botanical Gardens. The easiest of strolls are on the paths and sidewalks throughout the gardens. There are benches along the paths and walkways that are ADA

compliant for accessibility. The trails cross Wolf Creek, a major tributary of the Blue River, with two 75foot bridges.



The Arboretum also offers visitors a chance to view and experience a variety of ecosystems and local plant species in 180 acres of open prairie area.



Finish your visit at the LongHouse Visitor Center where you can take in stunning views of gardens and ponds. Grab a bite to eat at Café Celeste and discover unique treasures in the Gift Shop.

Tour 2: Taste of Kansas BBQ and Ventriloquist Friday, May 30, 2025 6:00 p.m. – 8:30 p.m.

Enjoy an evening of good food and fun right in the comfort of our hotel. No bus rides or worrying about the weather. The evening begins with a Hospitality Hour and cash bar from 5:00 - 6:00 p.m. that will be open to all convention attendees to catch up on the day's activities.

Those on tour will then transition to dinner and an evening that is sure to delight. Dinner chatter may be about sales room treasures, beautiful show room plants or what was learned at the presentations that day.

After dinner, we'll enter the world of Diana Rockwell, a professional

She is the author of the book "Experimental Ventriloquism," which is about using principles from fine art and applying them to a ventriloquist act.

Presentations 2025 AVSA Kansas City – Overland Park Convention



Session 1

"Unveiling the Wonders of Streptocarpus" Thursday, May 29 10:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Terri Vicenzi, Bloomington, Indiana

Terri is an award-winning grower of streptocarpus, African violets, and other gesneriads. She will share her experiences of growing and propagating them. Discover valuable cultural knowledge to refine your expertise and deepen your appreciation of these captivating plants.

Terri Vicenzi has a PhD in Biochemistry and spent 20+ years at Eli Lilly and Company in drug development. She has been a lifelong, avid collector of house plants and developed a keen interest in the cultivation of African violets, streptocarpus, and more since retiring in 2014. At her first Gesneriad Society convention in 2019, Terri won Best Streptocarpus and Runner-up to Best in Horticulture. When she's not repotting plants, she is typically working very large jigsaw puzzles.



Session 2 "Water Quality & Fertilizing for African Violets" Friday, May 30 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Steve Gonzalez, Stillwater, Minnesota

Learn about water quality and options you can take to improve the water you provide your plants. Discover the differences in typical commercially available fertilizers and which formulations and amounts would be most beneficial. See photos of an experiment that demonstrate how plant growth rates and conditions change with different water and fertilizing practices.

Steve Gonzalez has been growing orchids for over 40 years. Originally from San Juan, Puerto Rico, he worked with orchids in a local garden center, with the Botanical Gardens collection at the University of Puerto Rico, then at Pennock Gardens, the largest wholesale/retail garden center on the Island at that time. Steve has been a member of Orchid Society of Minnesota since 1991. Steve is currently an American Orchid Society judge and the Chair of the Chicago Judging Center.



Session 3 "Violets 101" Friday, May 30 3:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Mark Romansky, Henderson, Nevada

Want to learn the basics of culture, fertilizers, grooming, propagation and more? Mark presented a Violets 101 program for the public at the Phoenix convention and the feedback was super! His presentation is a nononsense approach to growing our favorite plant. People so enjoyed his way of presenting his approach to keeping things simple, we wanted to make his presentation a formal part of this year's convention.

Mark Romansky has been around African Violets for over 50 years. His parents were African violet enthusiasts, so vacations were planned around greenhouses and growers. Caught early by the orchid bug, Mark was a judge for the American Orchid Society and has judged nationally and internationally, including two World Orchid Conferences. Mark speaks on topics of horticulture, reptiles, parrots, rescue, re-homing, and special needs birds.



Session 4 "Next Level Design" Saturday, May 31 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Danny Tidwell, McRae, Arkansas

'Designer Dan' will host four top designers who will compete for the title of 'Next Level Designer'. Not only will they compete against each other, but also against the clock. The contestants will line up and race to the materials table to grab the best stuff before others can. They will be assigned a niche to create their design and must finish within the 20-min time limit. Oh! and there might be a 'curve ball' thrown in too. A panel of distinguished judges will critique the designs and choose the first ever "Next Level Designer". This promises to be fast and fun!

I have grown violets for over 20 years. Never considered a design until my house suffered substantial damage from a tornado in January of 1999. Loss of power for weeks took a heavy toll on plants, and they were not ready for our April show. I thought, maybe I can contribute to the show with designs. I ended up winning Best Design in Show and have continued my passion for design ever since.



Session 5 "Top Winners Tell All" Saturday, May 31 1:00 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. Scott Ammann, Highland, Illinois

This open forum will be a panel of this year's top winners. How's this for something FUN. Scott Ammann from Illinois will moderate a presentation for our members to question the 'top winners' at this year's convention. Who are they you ask? Well, here is where the fun and mystery comes in. The panel of three will be the exhibitors who win Best in Show - African violet, Horticulture Sweepstakes, and Best in Show - Other Gesneriad. We do not know who will be on this panel, it might be YOU! With Scott being our moderator, this promises to be fun, fast, and informative. The mystery makes this a must see at convention!

Scott discovered African violets at a local show at the Missouri Botanical Garden and couldn't believe there was a true everblooming house plant-- that could also be variegated! He quickly joined the local gesneriad group as well for the streptocarpus and stayed for the awesome people.

SECTION I – COLLECTIONS

- Class 1. AVSA Collection of three different registered standard cultivars of the same type (three single crown or three trailers).
 - 2. AVSA Collection of three different registered cultivars of the same type (three single-crown semiminiatures, three semiminiature trailers, three single-crown miniatures, or three miniature trailers).
 - 3. AVSA Collection of three different species of any type.
 - 4. Holtkamp Memorial Collection of three AVSA-registered Optimara and/or Rhapsodie cultivars of the same type: standard, semiminiature, or miniature.
 - 5. Robinson Collection of three AVSA-registered Rob's or Ma's cultivars of the same type: three singlecrown standards, semiminiatures or miniatures or three semiminiature or miniature trailers.
 - 6. Russian/Ukrainian Collection of three Russian/Ukrainian hybridized standard cultivars of the same type (three single-crown standards). These plants do not need to be AVSA-registered.
 - 7. Russian/Ukrainian Collection of three Russian/Ukrainian hybridized semiminiature or miniature cultivars of the same type (three semiminiatures or three miniatures). These plants do not need to be AVSA-registered.
 - 8. Lyndon Lyon Collection of three AVSA-registered Lyndon Lyon Greenhouses (including L. Lyon, P. Sorano and S. Sorano) cultivars of the same type: three single-crown standards, semiminiatures or miniatures or three standard, semiminiature, or miniature trailers.
 - 9. Cajun's Collection of three AVSA-registered Belinda Thibodeaux (Cajun's series) plants of the same type: three single-crown standards, semiminiatures or miniatures.
 - 10. Vintage Collection of three AVSA-registered Vintage Violets (must have been registered between the dates of 1/1/1960 and 1/1/1980) of the same *or any combination* of types either single-crown or trailer, standard, semiminiature or miniature.

Each exhibit in this section is a design using one or more blooming African violet plants (unless stated otherwise), removed from their pots, with their root balls encased in plastic or other material.

- Dried, treated, painted, colored and fresh-cut plant materials, as well as man-made materials, are permitted.
- Artificial plant material, live or dead creatures, and flags are not permitted.
- Accessories and backdrops are permitted unless restricted by class description.
- Only one exhibit per exhibitor per class.
- All niches will be white foam board. Exhibitors shall use niches provided by AVSA (not exhibitors' niches).
- Designs will be viewed from the front only.
- Class 74. **Japan** Sakura in Japanese means cherry blossom. A design which depicts the Sakura festivals that take place around this country. Staged in a white niche 10" H x 10" W x 5" D. Limit 4.
 - 75. **Romania** Is famous for its wood carvings of many shapes, sizes, and subjects. Use a piece of wood in your design. Staged in a white niche 24" H x 15" W x 7 1/2" D. Limit 4.
 - 76. **Mexico** Is famous for Mariachi Bands. Create a design with a musical theme. Staged in a white niche 24" H x 15" W x 7 1/2" D. Limit 3.
 - 77. Worlds of Fun Is a theme park located in Kansas City. Create a design featuring a roller coaster as a tribute to the convention theme. Staged in a white niche 24" H x 15" W x 7 1/2" D. Limit 3.

Section XIII – Interpretive Flower Arrangements

Each exhibit in this section is a design using fresh-cut African violet blossoms.

- Dried, treated, painted, colored, and fresh-cut plant materials, as well as man-made materials, are permitted.
- Artificial plant material, live or dead creatures, and flags are not permitted.
- Accessories, backdrops, and/or draping are permitted unless restricted by class description.
- Only one exhibit per exhibitor per class.
- All niches will be white foam board. Exhibitors shall use niches provided by AVSA (not exhibitors' niches). Risers will be provided.
- Designs will be viewed from the front only.
- Class 78. Australia Is known for the Great Barrier Reef. An underwater design not to exceed 12" in any direction. Backdrops are permitted. Limit 5.
 - 79. **China** Is famous for its Panda bears. An all black and white design except for the blossoms, which may be any color. Staged in a white niche 10" H x 10" W x 5" D. Limit 4.
 - 80. **United States** Has many rodeos all-across the country. A small design with a rodeo theme staged in light blue niche 5" H x 3" W x 2" D. No backdrop is allowed, but an underlayment is allowed. Limit 5.
 - 81. **Peru** Is known for the beautiful mountains of Machu Picchu. A monochromatic design in green, blossoms may be any color. Staged in a white niche 20" H x 15" W x 7 1/2" D. Limit 5.
 - 82. Russia Red Square in Moscow is famous for the Cathedral of St. Basil with its colorful domes. A mobile design staged in a white niche 24" H x 15" W x 7 1/2" D. Depth is not limited to the 7 ½". Limit 4.
 - 83. **Bahamas** The beautiful turquoise waters of the Bahamas is a perfect backdrop for a mirror image design. Use the color turquoise somewhere in your design. Staged in a free-standing 8" x 10" black picture frame. Limit 4.

Section XIV – Container Gardens

Each exhibit in this section is a miniature landscape with one or more blooming African violet plants and other growing material.

- All plants must be planted within the container.
- No cut plant material, artificial plant material, cacti, succulents, live or dead creatures, or flags are permitted.
- Accessories and landscaping elements are permitted.
- No decorative bases are allowed.
- Only one exhibit per class per exhibitor.
- Limit 5 exhibits per class.
- Class 84. **Dish Garden** A landscape design in a shallow dish less than or equal to 12" in its longest dimension.
 - 85. **Dish Garden** A landscape design in a shallow dish greater than 12" and less than 18" in its longest dimension.

- 86. **Terrarium** A landscape design in a covered terrarium, not to exceed 18" in its longest dimension.
- 87. **Natural Garden** A landscape design in a natural container. May have multiple planting areas. Not to exceed 18" in its longest dimension.

HORTICULTURE DIVISION – AMATEUR Rules and Regulations

- 1. Only amateur AVSA members in good standing who are registered at this convention and AVSA commercial members in good standing who are registered at this convention and *do not* offer plants or live plant material for sale as a part of a business are eligible to enter exhibits in this division.
- 2. Entries will be accepted on Wednesday, May 28th from 8:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
 - a. A pre-entry form is requested for all potential entries by **May 21, 2025.** It is easier to delete an entry than to enter it on the physical date of entries.
 - b. Exhibitors must report to the Classification and Entries area with their entries and completed entry form(s) to begin the entry process. Plants should be groomed prior to arriving in the Classifications and Entries area and be ready to begin the entry process an hour prior to closing at **4:00 p.m.**
 - c. Exhibitors with 20 entries or more must begin the entry process by **3:00 p.m**. No exceptions.
 - d. Entries must be physically in the Classifications and Entries area by closing at **5:00 p.m**. Only Placement may touch the entry once the entry process has begun. After Entries have completed, Placement will move the exhibit to the proper location in the show.
 - e. If an entry is not entered by the owner, the name of the person making the entry must be on the back of the entry tag.
- 3. Only clean, healthy plants which have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least three months will be accepted.
- 4. Plants must be correctly named.
- 5. Double potting, flared-top pots, supports, and collars will not be accepted. All pots must be non-decorative. DO NOT COVER POT WITH FOIL. Self-watering pots, such as Moist-Rite, Hydro Pots, and Oyama, etc., may be entered in colors such as white, black, green, or any neutral tone. All other plants must be slip-potted into pots in colors such as white, green or any neutral tone. Slip-potting means dropping the pot containing the plant into a clean pot of the same or just a fraction larger-sized pot. The bottom of the pot containing the plant must be completely covered with plastic or aluminum foil. This must be worked out prior to entry. Exception: trailers, trailing species, trailing gesneriads, and gesneriads in protective containers may be exhibited in the containers in which they are growing.
- 6. An exhibitor may enter only one of each cultivar in each class of Classes 11 through 73.
- 7. An exhibitor may enter plants of the same cultivar in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, as those in Classes 11 through 62, if all the requirements for each class are met.
- 8. All plants in Classes 1 through 62 must be single-crown plants except trailers and species, which may be multiple-crown. All Saintpaulia species and variations, without exception, may be entered in Class 3, 56 and 62.
- 9. Any number of new cultivars may be entered, provided they have been originated by the exhibitor from hybridization, from purchased seed, or from mutation, or the released rights in writing from the hybridizer have been given to the exhibitor for purchased seedlings. New cultivars may be entered by number or name, and the entry tag must indicate whether it is a new cultivar from seed or mutation. For judging purposes only, a random number will then be assigned to each new cultivar by entries. The name or hybridizer number of the new cultivars will be revealed after the completion of judging. A sport (mutant) may be exhibited as a "Sport of______." If a name has been given to the sport, the name in

parenthesis may follow, such as "Sport of 'Valencia' ('Dale's Dream')." New cultivars must not have been previously shown in an AVSA Convention Show.

- 10. Gesneriads (other than African violets) may be exhibited in protective containers, and natural-colored mulch may be used on the soil surface.
- 11. *Streptocarpus* specimens will be entered in appropriate color classes according to hybridizer's description. If a written description is not available, the *Streptocarpus* specimen will be entered in the appropriate color class by predominate color.
- 12. Exhibits will be judged by the merit method of judging, in accordance with the most current version of the *AVSA Handbook for Growers, Exhibitors and Judges*. The decision of the judges will be final unless in conflict with AVSA rules or rules of the schedule. Only qualified AVSA judges will be permitted to serve as judges.
- 13. Only blue-ribbon winners will be eligible to receive special awards.
- 14. Any African violet entered in any of the collection classes, receiving a blue ribbon, will be eligible for other awards.
- 15. All African violets entered in the Holtkamp Memorial Collection, Class 4, must be AVSA-registered Optimara and/or Rhapsodie plants and must be different plants of the same type.
- 16. All African violets entered in the Robinson Collection, Class 5; Lyndon Lyon Collection, Class 8; Cajun's Collection, Class 9; and Vintage Collection, Class 10 must be AVSA-registered. Russian/Ukrainian Collection Classes 6 and 7 do not need to be AVSA-registered.
- 17. An exhibiter may enter multiple Collection Classes but may enter only one collection in each class.
- 18. AVSA will afford all possible protection to exhibits but will not be responsible for any damage or loss.
- 19. Exhibits must be checked out on Saturday night, May 31, 2025. Instructions for checkout will be given at convention.
- 20. Live streaming of the preparation of show entries in any location is not permitted and will be cause for disqualification from exhibiting in the show and/or removal from the entries area.
- 21. All types of photography, video recordings and social media posts are strictly prohibited during judging.
- 22. Convention show photos and videos may be posted to social media only after the show has been officially opened to the public. This includes photographs or videos that identify the subject as a show entry.

DESIGN DIVISION Rules and Regulations

- 1. Exhibitors Both amateur and commercial AVSA members in good standing and registered at this convention are eligible to enter exhibits in this division.
- 2. Entries Entries will be accepted Wednesday, May 28, 2025, from 8:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- 3. Each exhibitor may have only one exhibit per class.
- Design work Exhibitors will be permitted to work on their designs until 9:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 28, 2025. This time will be strictly enforced. Designers may replace blooms and touch up designs on Thursday, May 29, 2025, from 6:30 a.m. until 8:00 a.m. Exhibitors must be out of the showroom by 8:00 a.m.
- 5. Procedure for getting supplies from commercials at convention can be found online at <u>Attention Designers</u>.
- 6. Index card All exhibits must have a 3" x 5" card listing the African violet cultivars and other plant materials (if known). A written subtitle may also be included on the card.
- 7. Advance written reservations are required for all design classes. Exhibitors desiring to enter designs must submit a completed reservation form available at <u>Attention Designers</u>. Reservations may be made as soon as the convention packet is available; the deadline for reservations will be May 5, 2025. Mail, email or text message your reservations to Design Entry Reservations Chair, Scott Ammann, 3278 Daiber Lane, Highland, IL 62249, <u>Scott.J.Ammann@gmail.com</u>, (618) 882-0322. All requests for reservations will be confirmed either by email or phone call/text message. If you need to cancel your design reservation, please let Scott know as soon as possible so that space can be used by another entrant on the waiting list. To cancel confirmed reservations or ask questions, you may call or text message Scott at (618) 882-0322.

- 8. No part of any design may touch or extend beyond the confines of the niche or space limitations, unless otherwise noted.
- 9. AVSA will afford all possible protection to exhibits but will not be responsible for any damage or loss.

HORTICULTURE DIVISION - COMMERCIAL Rules and Regulations

- 1. Only commercial AVSA members in good standing and registered at this convention who offer plants or live plant material for sale as a part of a business are eligible to enter this division. All commercial exhibitors are eligible to enter the Design Division.
- 2. All commercial members are allowed to enter all design and commercial classes without being excluded from any other commercial classes and may also enter a display table and a showcase.
- 3. For dates, times and entry process for entering exhibits, please refer to Rule 2 under HORTICULTURE DIVISION AMATEUR.
- 4. All plants must be correctly named and must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least three months prior to convention. All African violets must be in bloom and must be single-crown plants, except trailers and species.
- 5. In the Specimen Plant section, exhibitors may enter any number of plants in each class, but only one plant of the same cultivar in the same class. Exhibitors may enter plants of the same cultivar in the AVSA Collection Classes 89, 90 and 91 and the Holtkamp Memorial Collection Class 92, as are entered in the other classes. Exhibitors may enter one collection in each collection class. Plants entered in the Holtkamp Memorial Collection class must be AVSA-registered Optimara/Rhapsodie plants. AVSA collection rules are the same as they are for amateurs.
- 6. Any African violet plant in Specimen Plants, (Section B New Cultivars classes) Display Table, or Commercial Showcase sections may be designated as competing for the AVSA Best New Cultivar Awards. Entries may be seedlings, sports, or mutants originated by the exhibitor, or rights and ownership to them released by the hybridizer and must not have been previously shown in an AVSA Convention show. Each entry must be labeled "New Cultivar."
- 7. An exhibitor entering the Display Table class may also enter other design and commercial classes. Each display table shall contain 15 plants (no merchandise). Three, all the same type, miniatures or semiminiatures, or miniature or semiminiature trailers, shall count as a specimen plant and shall be judged as one unit. The display must be predominantly (at least 75%) African violets. Other gesneriads may be included in the 15 plants and will be judged as one unit. AVSA will provide white table covers for display tables; however, display tables may be covered with any color or pattern at the exhibitor's discretion.
- 8. Exhibits in the Commercial Showcase classes will be allotted table space sufficient for their display. Table covers will be neutral. Exhibits in these classes shall contain 6-10 plants, either miniature, semiminiature, standard, or trailing African violets, or other gesneriads. Showcases must be predominantly (75%) African violets or designs using African violets. The Showcase-Horticulture only class, shall be a collection of 6-10 plants, (exhibitor may designate one plant as a unit or three plants as a unit) with NO embellishment. The Showcase-Artistic class must include a creative aspect and may include designs (flower or plant arrangements or container gardens) incorporating African violets. Showcases-Horticulture and Showcases-Artistic shall both be judged on horticultural perfection. Horticultural perfection shall be computed by finding the average points per plant in the Showcase. No merchandise will be allowed in these classes. Awards for the Showcase-Horticulture only class, shall be based 100% on horticultural perfection. Awards for the Showcase-Artistic class, shall be based on 80% horticultural perfection and 20% on distinction and originality. Awards will be given for best, second-best and third-best for the Display Table, Showcase-Horticulture only, and Showcase-Artistic classes.
- 9. In Commercial Showcases, each entry in the exhibit will be judged. Showcase-Horticulture only class shall use standard plant name and entry tags supplied by Entries. In the Showcase-Artistic class, the exhibitor has the option to use the standard plant name tag provided by Entries, or to provide his or her own tag or diagram. The entry book number of each plant or arrangement must appear on the tag or diagram. For the

Showcase-Horticulture only class, no ribbon awards will be given. Instead, each showcase with all blueribbon exhibits will receive a rosette. A point score sheet shall be given each exhibitor showing how awards were determined. (Please note: An exhibitor may choose to NOT have their Showcase judged).

- 10. A 6-foot table with three tiers will be furnished for each exhibitor in the Display Table class. Uniformly covered tables shall be furnished. The exhibitor may provide their own covering. Colored lights which distort or enhance the color of the plants will not be permitted.
- 11. Any shape and type of pot for specimen plants will be permitted except flared top pots. Supports and collars will not be permitted. Pots in the specimen plant section must be slip-potted into clean, non-decorative pots in colors such as white, green, or any neutral tone. The bottom of the pot containing the plant must be completely covered with plastic or aluminum foil. The pot is then inserted into a pot of the same size or shape. The inside pot may be of any color and may extend above the rim of the outside pot. Exceptions to slip-potting are self-contained reservoirs (i.e., Oyama, Moist-Rite, Hydro Pots, etc.) in colors such as white, green, black, or any neutral tone. Pots in the Display Table class do not have to be covered and may be elevated and tilted with individual potholders.
- 12. Signs, cards, or codes identifying the exhibitor may not be displayed on the display tables or Commercial Showcases prior to judging.
- 13. Exhibits will be judged by the merit method of judging, in accordance with the most current version of the *AVSA Handbook for Growers, Exhibitors and Judges*. The decision of the judges is final unless in conflict with AVSA rules or rules of the schedule. Only qualified AVSA judges will be permitted to serve as judges.
- 14. Only blue-ribbon winners will be eligible to receive awards.
- 15. Exhibits in the Display Table class and the Commercial Showcase classes will not count toward Commercial Sweepstakes or Design Sweepstakes Awards.
- 16. Rosettes will be awarded as merited to the exhibitors receiving first, second, and third highest number of points in each Display Table and Commercial Showcase class. An Honorable Mention Rosette will be awarded to the exhibitor receiving the fourth highest number of points.
- 17. Streptocarpus specimens will be entered in appropriate color classes according to hybridizer's description. If a written description is not available, the Streptocarpus specimen will be entered in the appropriate color class by predominate color.
- 18. AVSA will afford all possible protection to exhibits but will not be responsible for any damage or loss.

To accommodate design flower and plant needs, a plan was created with the commercials who sell at convention. It has been reviewed and approved by the AVSA Commercial members and the Kansas City convention show committee. The plan provides:

- Designers with the materials needed to complete their entries, and
- Peace and quiet for the commercials while setting up on Wednesday.

Supplies for Designers

Each designer will be given a "pass" to purchase plant material in the sales room from 1:00 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 28, 2025. Handicapped designers may be accompanied by one caregiver.

The pass lists the specific classes in which the designer is entered. No unnecessary/extra purchases are allowed.

There is a 15-minute time limit for the designer to be in the sales room. Designers who appear to be abusing the privilege will be escorted from the sales room and denied any further "design" purchases.

The Design Reservation Chair or helpers will control the distribution of the passes to the designers.

A list of participating commercials will be provided. Please do not disturb other commercials.

Commercials may choose to complete the financial transaction during this process or may allow the designer to run a tab for payment later.

Although participating commercials will make every attempt to have supplies available during this time, they may not have what you need. Please have your own Plan B ready.

Designers are welcome to pre-order supplies to be picked up at convention. This is highly encouraged.

NOTE: Cheryl Graan, Design Reservations Chair Assistant, has compiled a list of local greenhouses and hobby stores nearby to the convention hotel where you may purchase last minute line material, terrarium/dish garden plants, and accessories. Judging School

A judging school is offered for AVSA members during convention. The school will be held on Wednesday, May 28, 2025, from 8:15 am until 3:30 pm and focuses on judging an AVSA show. It is appropriate for first-time students, certificate renewals, or established judges to keep up to date.

The examination consists of three parts and requires 75 points or higher to receive a new or renewal judge's card:

- 50 points an open book test (emailed on May 5th, to be turned in at the beginning of school)
- 40 points classroom written test
- 10 points point scoring of two African violet plants

All students must bring a current copy of the **AVSA Handbook for Growers, Exhibitors and Judges** (14th Edition, revised May 2022) to the school.

You must present a current AVSA membership card and judge's card (if already a judge) at the door. If you have your proof of three blue ribbons, that documentation should be presented. Since proof of three blue ribbons is currently being waived, you may take the exam; however, a judge's card will not be issued until the Judging School Teacher is contacted and proof of three blue ribbons is presented. Please read the AVSA Judges section in the *Handbook* for further information.

The cost is \$20 and applies to all who attend the judging school, either to take the test or to audit the class.

Registration and payment for the Judging School occur within the online Convention Registration process.

Registration and payment are due by April 25, 2025.

As a reminder, all Student and Advanced Judging Certificates will expire on June 15, 2025. However, if a judging school was taken in 2022 or after and a new certificate was issued, your updated expiration date will be noted on your new card. This school will likely be the last opportunity for judges to take an exam before the June 15, 2025 expiration date.

You will be contacted by the Judging School Teacher with more details closer to convention.
