After serving the past twelve (12) months as your President, I reflect on the leadership knowledge and experience I gained as a member of the EC and Board of Directors over the past eleven (11) years. During my two (2) year term, your Society leadership has been directed and will continue to focus on the following Executive Goals/Priorities:

- Provide public outreach and education using extensive marketing, various popular social media platforms, and other innovative communication strategies to effectively grow our presence, engage diverse communities, and encourage a robust and diverse membership;
- Expand the connectivity and quality of our information technology products and services (especially First Class software and applications) through innovative, improved, and affordable technology solutions; and
- Continue streamlining and improvement of AVSA business operations and services.

I am so very grateful for the many enthusiastic and talented workers/volunteers who donate their time and valuable skills to support the Society. Board of Directors show their dedication by supporting the Society by attending meetings and contributing many new, innovative ideas to further the Society. They give their time selflessly to attend meetings and accomplish many fruitful tasks.

I learned a lot, especially from working with the talented committee chairs noted in this report, as well as committees from prior years. Much work was undertaken and completed as the Society has over the past six (6) years, made great strides in rebranding our organization with a fresh, new look, new technologies, new membership, and a growing community of African violet enthusiasts! Our hopes are high that we will continue these successes with the hard work of all our Society committees. Committees – please accept my sincerest gratitude for your dedication to our organization and your commitment to making your committee work positively impact who we are.

As AVSA President and chair of your AVSA Executive Committee, we regularly conduct EC monthly and other specially called meetings and events via Zoom or at selected AVSA affiliate event venues. The Spring EC meeting is held on the Monday of national convention week. The Fall meeting is usually hosted by a regional council/affiliate at different locations each year. With the advent of remote meeting technologies, the Society has made great strides in conducting regular and special Society business on a more frequent basis than just the previous Spring and Fall meetings.

The EC meets regularly with Amy Carruth, Office Manager, to keep abreast with the daily operations of the national office, to maintain healthy lines of communication, and address any requests from office staff. Amy

and I usually connect weekly to keep updated on office issues. I frequently travel through Beaumont and spend face-to-face time with office staff in person. They are quick to have me help with the telephone calls while I am there! I have also stamped envelopes and even helped with the daily office work!

Your EC will continue to work on the strategic planning process as a major foundation upon which the Society will achieve its critical mission. This is noteworthy, as outcomes from this process provide the Society with a focused direction and approach for the future. Input from all Committees continues to be instrumental in how this future direction is put into play. This is an excellent opportunity for all Committees and volunteers to make a difference in the future of our Society. To meet the Executive Goals/Priorities noted previously, the EC will continue work to “fine-tune” committee governance by consolidating committees and streamlining Society business and committee processes, roles, and responsibilities. Consolidation of committees to better meet the business needs of the Society is crucial to maintaining efficiencies, as well as improve allocation of our limited and much-valued volunteer resources. The Society is like many nonprofit organizations today, working to maintain healthy membership numbers as we provide valuable resources and information to our growing communities. I continue to encourage all of you to do your part and help your Vice Presidents in this process through your continued input and feedback, especially with recommendations of where improved efficiencies can be implemented and realized.

I continue to work hard to enhance and improve - wherever possible - communications between all the Society committees, especially when committees overlap. It is important for all Society committees to communicate and collaborate whenever possible, as this is a wonderful way to enhance the effectiveness of our limited volunteer resources to achieve all the work we do. All Society Committees can now coordinate use of the AVSA Zoom license by contacting Richard Craft, TechWeb Chair and AVSA 2nd Vice President.

With planning almost completed for the upcoming 2026 Dallas National Convention, I continue to be guardedly optimistic about in-person attendance. Post-pandemic issues, our struggling economy, competing hobby interests, and overall “social fatigue” continue to be the driving forces behind attendance and participation decisions. The Society will be focusing on Executive Goal/Priority #1 to provide public outreach and education using extensive marketing, various popular social media platforms, and other innovative communication strategies to effectively grow our presence, engage diverse communities, and encourage a robust and diverse membership.

Work continues on cleanup and reorganization of the Society archives. The archival project/initiative to use current technologies to build on the archive framework setup by Janet Riemer and digitize, store, and archive current paper artifacts continues. The Society now uses cloud technologies to store many electronic records previously recorded on paper media. Work is continuing to transfer artifacts from paper boxes to plastic storage bins to add protection wherever possible. The Society archive room is filled with so much Society history, and I enjoy every opportunity possible to connect with all the physical artifacts stored there.

Membership growth remains relatively stagnant. Amy continues to report new memberships are still happening, but the Society continues to lose about as many members as are gained during the years. I encourage each of you to reach out to the public to garner interest and encourage new memberships.

Since September 2019, I have functioned as the AVSA Business Continuity/Disaster Recovery (BC/DR) Coordinator and offer my continued support in this role as long as needed. The AVSA BC/DR policy and procedures implemented in 2023 position the Society to now be better prepared for any unexpected future events.

I actively participate in the Lone Star African Violet Council activities as LSAVC Newsletter Editor and as a Commercial Vendor. Although attendance was still low compared to years pre-pandemic, the show was filled with beautiful entries. Post-pandemic issues as well as shrinking wallets continue to impact attendance and sales at all events. I encourage all to continue to attend – in person - local, state council, and national events, as these are the foundations of keeping interest going in our AV growing communities.

I currently serve as Secretary/Treasurer/Parliamentarian of the Central Texas Judges Council and as President of the Heart of Texas African Violet Society, one of Texas' newest affiliates, specializing in public outreach and education using remote technologies. HOTAVS is proud to report over 37 educational presentations since 2022, promoting public outreach and education. HOTAVS is designated by the IRS as a 501(c)(3).

I continue to present numerous AV-related presentations across the country (via zoom and local sites), as well as provide my services as a Senior Judge for shows and displays. Visitors to my website www.ghviolets.com can find downloadable **free** information files about AVs, including access to my personal blog – “AV Chatterbox.” I offer my services **gratis** and ask that any donations be made to the Society in lieu of speaker fees. I am passionate about public outreach and education about AVs, and this is my way of giving back to the Society. I will continue this as long as I am able to travel and can afford it.

I continue my education as an AVSA Senior Judge by auditing and attending judging schools whenever and wherever possible. Being able to separate the classroom component into online education has been extremely beneficial to me as well as other Board of Directors members who are also continuing their education. Kudos to the Show and Judges Committee for developing/evolving this improved curriculum for judging. Your judges really needed this!

As I wrap up my first year as your AVSA President, I am excited about what your AVSA Leadership will accomplish over the next year. I thank the EC, EB, and the AVSA membership for the opportunity to serve in this capacity. It continues to be a humbling experience and has been most certainly memorable. Please continue to go forth and be advocates for our Society. Encourage new membership and participate in more public outreach and education and share the love of our African violets.

General Activities

First year serving as third Vice-president has been a valuable learning experience along the way. The following were activities I completed or are ongoing since my election at the 2025 convention:

Directors and their Representative Role Assignments

With the reduction of the number of total directors over the next couple years, I have developed a rule to assign Directors as Representatives or affiliate liaisons across the region (keeping approximately the same number of 'zones' Richard Craft established prior) beginning after this year's convention:

Region 1-2, Region 3-4, Region 5-6, Region 7-8, Region 9-10, Region 11

In the event a region does not have a representative Director elected, the next adjacent region with MORE Directors will be assigned to that non-represented region (*rule 1*). For example, region 5-6 has 2 Directors, region 7-8 has 0 Directors, and region 9-10 has 3 Directors. Region 9-10 with 3 Directors will be assigned to unrepresented region 7-8. In the event of a tie, the region with the lowest region number designation will represent the unrepresented regions (*rule 2*) (i.e. directors for region 5-6 will serve as liaison for 7-8, NOT 9-10 if both 5-6 and 9-10 have 2 Directors each). If Region 1-2 have no Directors represented, I (3rd VP) will serve as the Affiliate liaison.

The following example with multiple regions with 0 directors and its integration (*rule 1*):

2 – 0 – 0 – 4 – 2 – 1 = 9 directors

2 – 0 – 4 <- 4 – 2 – 1 rule applied once: Region 7-8 has 4 Directors will be responsible for 5-6

2 – 4 <- 4 <- 4 – 2 – 1 rule applied twice: Region 7-8 will ALSO be responsible for 3-4

In the event of two adjacent regions with 0 directors and tied on either ends:

2 – 0 – 0 – 2 – 4 – 1 = 9 directors

2 – 0 – 2 <- 2 – 4 – 1 region 7-8 directors are responsible for 5-6 (*rule 1* applied)

2 -> 2 – 2 <- 2 – 4 – 1 region 1-2 directors are responsible for 3-4 in the event of a tie (*rule 2* applied)

#iloveAVscontest

Was initiated and voting is ongoing until March 1, 2026. The purpose of the initiative was to 1) increase traffic and membership to African Violet Society of America, Inc. Group on Facebook; 2) make the connection between African violet culture and their growers, which was often lacking in media when only the plants are displayed; and 3) allow the grower to tell a story of how African violets have impacted their life. Though participation for the new

contest was low (3 participants), the stories were moving and worthy of being published. Members of the group will vote to decide the winners.

The awards I have created from my own funds:

1st Place: A paid package registration for the AVSA 2026 Dallas Convention (valued up to \$300) or a two-year AVSA membership (\$70 value). Plus, your photo will be featured in the African Violet Magazine (AVM) and other AVSA media platforms.

2nd and 3rd Place: A one-year digital AVSA membership or \$32 off AVSA merchandise, along with your photo being featured in the AVM and other AVSA media platforms.

Securing raw data of ALL African violet registrations from First Class

After consulting TechWeb, it was concluded that securing all the registration data from First Class was deemed unfeasible due to number of entries. Therefore, I utilized my background in high throughput, high volume database structure to secure all the data in raw format. This universal format is tab delimited and allows the user or program to utilize it in any future software or application (whether spreadsheets or text application, or called upon by any newly developed app) with ease. This is essential in a technology driven society when new programming languages are adopted and older ones phased out, and reduces downtime and compatibility issues associated with operating system updates.

After securing the data, I am manually tab delimiting the entries and seeing that there are data entry errors including hybridizers' names being incorrectly spelled and dates ending with "-0-0". I will also have to update hybridizers' names to change from initial and last name to their full first and last name, such as P. Hancock to Pat Hancock. Additionally, we can decide to add additional information to the new database that will feature additional information of registered or listed plants including 1) seed parent/female; 2) pollen doner/male; 3) Sport of: and 4) Resulting sports:

Presentations

I have given 4 presentations on lighting in 2025 and 1 beginning of 2026, with an upcoming one to a group of Master Gardener's from the Frederick County, Maryland division.

Authorships

I have written 2 and co-written 2 articles with Dale Martens on topics related to wick watering and daily light integral (DLI) of various gesneriad family members. The DLI article will be a valuable reference guide to all who want to know and grow with the precise amount of artificial lights to achieve show quality plants.

Convention/Show Exhibitions and Judging

I have attended, exhibited, and judged at the National Capital Area Chapter of the Gesneriad Society in fall of 2025 and attended, exhibited, and judged the Mid-Atlantic African Violet Society's convention in November 2025. Several awards including Best Streptocarpus, Best Lyndon Lyon, and a few Best in Classes.

Chair of Scholarship Committee

Currently chairing the committee and have asked Dr. Jeff Smith to serve on the committee to assess scholarship candidates' applications. Scholarship applications are due March 1, 2026.

Finance--Terri Post, Chair

During the first four months of 2025, I compiled and prepared the financial statements for fiscal year 2024, and I also filed an extension for the 2024 Form 990 tax return. I then prepared a 2026 budget to be presented to the board.

In June of 2025, I prepared and filed the 2024 Form 990 tax return. This return is public information and a copy can be obtained by filing a written request to the AVSA office. The return is also available for the public to view at www.guidestar.org. This is a website endorsed by the IRS.

To recap AVSA investments:

The Life Fund is primarily invested in bonds and CDs. A few CDs were called and/or matured during 2025 and the funds from them was reinvested into primarily CDs. The approximate rate of return for the entire fund was 2.08%. AVSA also had to withdraw \$10,000 from this fund during 2025 in order to meet operating expenses. The Life Fund consists primarily of savings and house proceeds.

The BERF fund has been invested in CDs and a mutual fund. The BERF committee has asked to keep some of this fund liquid in order to pay out any possible scholarships, as needed. Scholarships are to be paid from earnings of this fund. The approximate rate of return for this fund during 2025 was 4.25%. Scholarships of \$2,000 were also awarded from this fund during 2025.

The Tinari Fund has been invested mainly in CDs and bonds. The approximate rate of return for this fund was 4.68%. One half of the annual earnings from this fund is used for operating expenses upon board approval, this amounted to \$5,835 during 2025.

The Burde Fund has been invested in bonds and some CDs. The approximate return for this fund during 2025 was 2.33%. The fund is to be used for tech expenses upon board approval. During 2025, this amounted to \$6,664. During the year 2025, the Hudson monies earned approximately 2.3%. It is hoped that this fund will be able to pay for future awards with earnings.

I feel that we have been able to reinvest earnings on our investments and, at year-end we were able to draw on the earnings to help us with immediate cash needs. This enables us to continue to grow and provides financial stability for the future, as was the desire of the original endowment policy.

The 2027 budget will be prepared and presented to the board for approval at the Dallas convention.

During the calendar year of 2025 a total of 139 new cultivar registrations from 28 hybridizers have been approved. This is a substantial increase in the number of registrations and hybridizers compared to calendar year 2024. The increase is largely due to the efforts of Vladimir Kalgin in assisting the registrations from numerous Russian hybridizers. The committee is grateful to him for his help and assistance.

During the 2025 AVSA Convention in Overland Park, KS, a list of Russian cultivars was generated by convention participants for inclusion in First Class. This effort was only partially successful for various reasons (e.g. death of the hybridizer) but some plants from this list were included in the 2025 new registrations.

To date for calendar year 2026, 3 applications from 2 hybridizers have been received for registration and are currently in process. One additional plant for “listing” has been received and is also under review.

The information about “listing” a plant is in the process of being updated on the AVSA website. Additional changes will be made to the checkout page for paying fees to the AVSA office. Listing, rather than registration, is appropriate for plants of uncertain parentage (e.g. seedlings from commercial seed mixtures) or those who lack sufficient genetic stability for the three-generation rule requirement.

The International Society for Horticultural Science (ISHS) contacted Dr. Smith for an update report for the AVSA to serve as the International Cultivar Registration Authority (ICRA) for African violets. Dr. Smith completed the

application which was signed by AVSA President Glenda Williams. The update was approved by the ISHS and the AVSA will continue to serve as the ICRA authority for African violets for another two-year period.

The ISHS commented that the practice used by Dr. Smith and his committee to check the Russian transliterated names for acceptability using ChatGPT was unique and would be recommended as standard practice to other ICRA authorities. While non-Roman alphabet names can be transliterated, but not translated, use of ChatGTP allows checks to be made the acceptability of suggested names for new cultivars.

The posting of new cultivars to First Class has been assisted by the Tech/Web Committee and especially the work of Chris Thompson. The Plant Registration Committee is extremely grateful for their work and help in addressing the many technical issues. Updates to First Class are nearly complete and the last batch of 2025 new cultivars should be available shortly after their publication in the March/April issue of the African Violet Magazine.

Dr. Smith has been working with Ron Myhr and Prof Dirk Bellstedt on updates to the *Streptocarpus* section of The Gesneriad Reference Web. Prof Bellstedt has authored a comprehensive article on the genus and we have coordinated our information so that the taxonomic classification and names for African violets are consistent between his article and Dr. Smith's article. Only a few corrections were required, and the article will be very helpful for understanding the entire genus of *Streptocarpus* for classification and shows.

Old Business

Dr. Smith serves on the Research Committee for The Gesneriad Society, Inc. This allows him to spot potential research projects for the AVSA from the proposal submissions to The Gesneriad Society.

A new grant application was received on February 21, 2024 from Dr. Cornelius Kyalo of the National Museums of Kenya. The application was titled: "Rescuing the last two populations of the critically endangered *Streptocarpus ionanthus* subsp. *rupicola* from limestone mining in coastal Kenya". The Research Committee reviewed the grant application and recommended funding. Funding for the amount of \$4500 was approved at the April 23, 2024 business meeting of the AVSA.

New Business

A final report for the grant to Dr. Kyalo has been received and will be forwarded with this report. The final report includes an accounting of his expenses and results of his work. The Research Committee is especially delighted that he has involved local communities in the conservation work of this project. We know that conservation efforts that are community based have a higher success rate than those that don't. Dr. Kyalo is currently preparing an article on this project for publication in the African Violet Magazine as required by the conditions of the grant award.

No additional grant requests or projects are currently under review at this time.

There were 5 judging schools offered in 2025. At these schools, a total of 20 students earned their student judge certificate. There were 7 new advanced judges, and 9 renewed their advanced judge certificate. Cathy Heider from Wisconsin became a new teacher.

A total of 24 took the Continuing Education course for Master Judges. Zoom Continuing Education courses were offered on January 18, 2025, and July 13, 2025, with 16 judges total in attendance. To qualify for their continuing education course, the senior judge exam was taken by 3 master judges, 3 audited a judging school, and 2 taught a school. The following were moved to Master Judge Emeritus status: Brenda Brasfield (MS), Mary Ann Giangerella (VA), Bob Kurzynski (NJ), Laurene Jones (VA), and Linda Owens (OH).

The Teaching Tools Manual is being updated to reflect changes implemented in the 2022 edition of the Handbook. It is being reformatted.

Vladimir Kalgin will be reviewing the Russian/Ukrainian transliteration for varieties entered in the AVSA national convention show in Dallas and the AVM. Thanks to the collaborative work of Dr. Jeff Smith and Vladimir Kalgin, many Russian/Ukrainian varieties are in the process of being listed in First Class.

It is an honor to serve AVSA as Shows and Judges Chair. The support of the general membership, Board, and Executive Committee is greatly appreciated.

- Continued support for Virtual Circle (renamed to Virtual Violet Connection) website updates and registration through iMIS
- Louise provided primary support for installations of AVSA Show Entry Awards on a case-by-case basis. Windows 11 continued to be problematic with missing system files having to be loaded on individual machines.
- In August, 2025 Chris traveled to Illinois to meet with Joe Bruns to discuss the ongoing issues of reprogramming both AVSA Show Entry Awards and First Class Database Updater.
- 2026 Dallas Convention website

- We aim to engage an experienced WordPress technician to oversee and maintain our website. The significant challenges encountered recently have exceeded the capabilities of our current team.

- Ownership of AVSA Show Entry Awards and First Class awaits signature from programmer (Joe Bruns) to AVSA.
- Ownership of First Class For All software transfer is scheduled to take place at the 2026 Dallas Convention from programmer (David Kesler) to AVSA.
- Future plans are to rewrite the programs (AVSA Show Entry Awards, First Class/First Class For All and First Class Database Updater) using a current programming language to seamlessly work together.
- Focused website improvement areas include: Affiliates, Plant Registration, Shows and Judges. A planned overhaul will be to move all Membership Only documents to the secure iMIS server.
- A long list of requests that get worked on as time and skills permit.

Currently chairing the committee and have asked Dr. Jeff Smith to serve on the committee to assess scholarship candidates' applications. Scholarship applications are due March 1, 2026.

Tally Time--Susan Anderson, Chair

The duties for the Tally Time committee have been completed. There were a total of 44 reports from affiliates. A total of 251 different African violet varieties (252 species and 226 hybrids) were recorded. The final report was submitted on December 1, 2025, for inclusion in the March issue of the AVM.

The results will be shared with the TechWeb Committee for posting on the AVSA website.

Again this year there was some difficulty in obtaining the reports from affiliates. I sent reminders to many clubs to encourage them to send in their results. Reports were submitted via numerous formats. Results were (1) snail-mailed as hard copy hand-written forms, (2) scanned and emailed, (3) from the online website form, or (4) emailed directly from the Entries program. I even received two reports as (5) pictures via text message, after I contacted each affiliate about lacking their results. Several others, I obtained via the (6) And the Winners Are... column results.

I do hope that the process for submitting results becomes more streamlined to ease the compilation effort. The easiest format for me to work off is the database that is produced from the online website form; however, the TechWeb committee informed me last year that this format will be ending. As a result, I retype all the submitted data into an excel spreadsheet to enable the tally to be completed. This introduces opportunities for errors and mistakes. Yet, I will continue with this until a better solution is available.

Since submitting the final tables, a member of the Editorial Committee questioned one of the species that appeared in the final tally. He was under the impression that the noted species variety was no longer in circulation, so those reported winning plants may be incorrectly named by the growers. While there may in fact be inaccurate naming of plants, I can only report on the results provided to me.

There were no expenses for this committee. I do not foresee any future budget needs for this committee.
